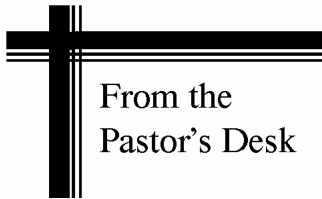
A special thank you to the PSR children for saving their coins for the missions. The amount collected was \$312.95. God bless all of you for your happy giving hearts.

Tom Hyland (pastor emeritus of St. Peter's in North Ridgeville) died on Memorial Day. He had been pastor of St. Peter's for 23 years. A man of many talents, and in spite of being ill for a long time he was one of the most humorous people I had ever known. We pray for him and all our deceased priests.
