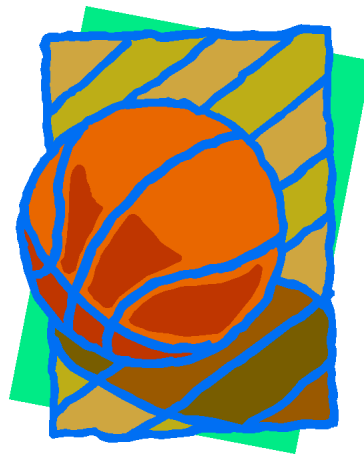

Mrs. Bay's Eighth Grade

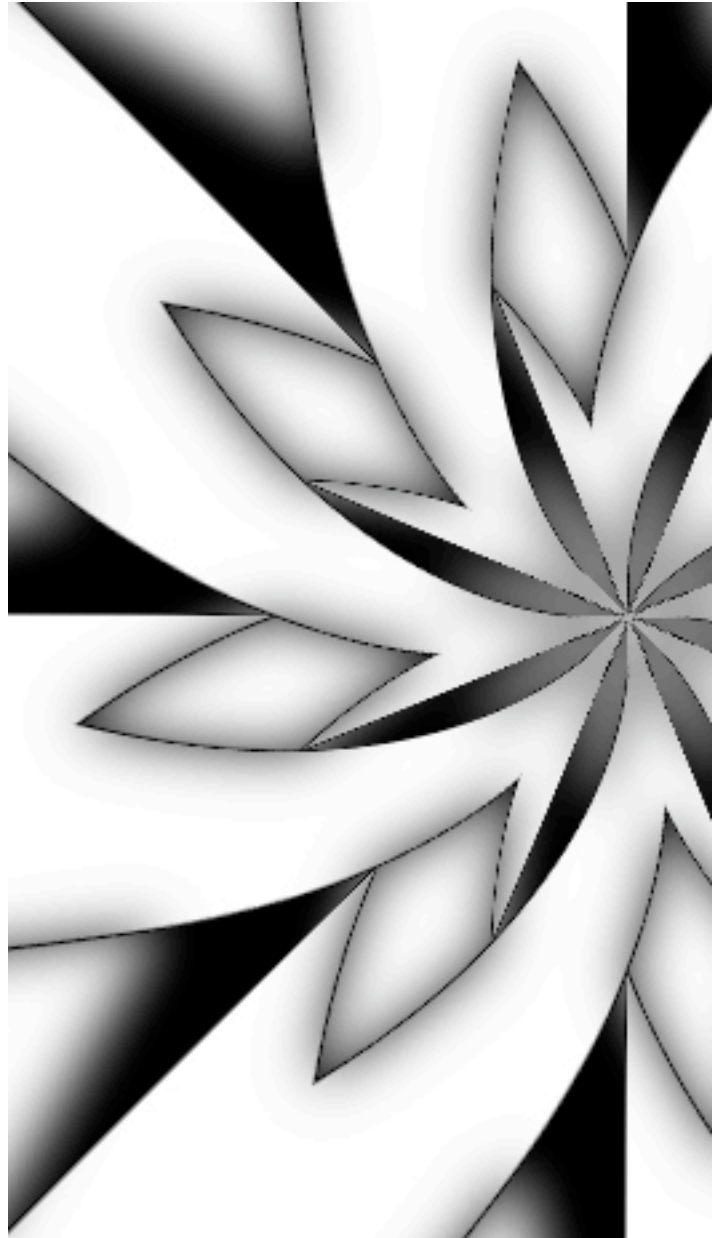
